As some of you know, the 2019 Special General Conference of the United Methodist Church convened its work on February 26. The conference met to address matters regarding human sexuality. Three main plans were proposed to seek ways to move forward in unity as a denomination. The plan the Council of Bishops chose, "The One Church Plan," did not pass. This plan would have allowed United Methodist clergy to perform same-gender weddings and allow annual conferences to ordain LGBTQIA pastors. The plan that prevailed was the Traditionalist Plan. This plan maintains the global United Methodist teaching on human sexuality that declares "homosexuality is incompatible with Christian teaching."

As we process the outcome of GC2019, know that Lovely Lane United Methodist Church is first, and foremost, the church of Jesus Christ, a church that loves and welcomes ALL people. I want to refer you to the statement on the back of the weekly worship bulletin. (See Lovely Lane UMC Vision on page 2, also found on the church website at <https://www.lovelylane.org/our-mission-and-vision/>.) The statement speaks of love and light, Christ's love and Christ's light, which is in us and shines out to those around us. It is this light and love that must sustain and motivate us in ministry, especially in the wake of GC2019.

In the words of a delegate at GC2019, "The church is not the General Conference." The church is YOU, the followers of Jesus Christ at Lovely Lane UMC. Regardless of the direction of the larger United Methodist Church, Lovely Lane UMC is a place where all people may find the love of Christ, seek refuge in the storm, and connect with the power of the Holy Spirit. When youth have tough conversations about their faith and daily life, love and light permeate the space. As disciples of all ages come together on Wednesdays for supper and faith formation, Christ shows up in one another. When people from the community come through the doors of the church for Justice for Our Neighbors (JFON), Children's Weekday Ministries, Boy Scouts, and other events, this church is the light of Christ, shining in the darkness. As followers of Jesus gather for worship, Christ's light shines as worshipers find common ground in the presence of the Holy Spirit.

We will continue to plan for the future ministries of making disciples and, in doing so, will grow in our faithfulness as Christ's church. After all, "Our vision is to reflect God's glory in our congregation, in our world, and in our hearts. Forgiven by Christ, we forgive. Accepted by God, we accept. Empowered by the Holy Spirit, we equip, enable and inspire God's household to servant leadership." We shine Christ's light because, "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness doesn't extinguish the light." (John 1:5, CEB) I hope you will all continue to walk with me as we share Christ's love and shine the light of Christ that will never be extinguished. *Pastor Jenny*

FORTY DAYS AND FORTY NIGHTS

"Let us occupy ourselves entirely in knowing God." – Brother Lawrence

Lent is a period of forty days and forty nights that leads to Easter. The forty days represent the time Jesus spent in the wilderness facing temptation. The season begins with Ash Wednesday. During this period, we are to focus on our mortality, our sinfulness, and our need for a resurrected Savior. At times, this involves giving something up like sweets, second helpings, or social media. Other times, it involves taking on something new like devotions, study, fasting, or service. The aim is to do whatever it takes to bring you closer to Christ.

A general way I approach Lent is to simply focus on "time"; I need to spend more time with Christ. This can mean giving something up or taking on something new. One of the best ways to spend time with Christ is to simply read the Bible. The stories and teachings of Jesus found in the Bible did not originate as documents on which theological positions and creeds were formed. The stories and teachings emerged as reports from real life. People who encountered Jesus shared these stories. Within time, the Gospel writers gathered these accounts and put them into written form.

Eventually, the Gospels were read aloud in worship services and were always intended to evoke responses and emotions. Though centuries have passed since the Gospels were written, the stories still evoke responses and emotions . . . and change lives.

During this Lenten season, we are sharing some of the stories and teachings of Jesus found in the Gospel of John. In particular, we're focusing on the "I Am" statements of Jesus. Jenny and I will have a preaching series entitled "Knowing God." The series connects with the book we'll use in some of our study groups: *The God We Can Know* by Rob Fuquay.

Our hope is that we will become better acquainted with these "I Am" statements and make these sayings an essential part of our Christian way of life. Christianity is more than a religion. It is a living relationship with Jesus that desires care and devotion, strengthened with obedience and reverence. The "I Am" statements encourage us to move into that deeper walk with the Lord.

I look forward to being on this Lenten journey with each of you. We have so much to learn from the Holy Scriptures. We have so much to learn from God and others! *A Thousand Blessings to each of You!* Pastor Scott

Our 6th-8th grade youth group will be involved in a mission trip this summer helping M25 during Transform Week, June 24-28.

Restoring Vision provides reading to people in underdeveloped and impoverished countries. Vision is one of our most important senses. It impacts one's ability to interact with the environment and other people. By providing a simple pair of reading glasses, we can immediately and positively impact a person's life, the well-being of one's family and community.

Heifer International is a non-profit, humanitarian organization dedicated to ending hunger and poverty as well as caring for the earth. Heifer provides livestock, trees and seeds plus trains the beneficiaries by teaching them skills to further lift themselves out of poverty.

Trinity Lane Preschool is mid-way thru its 1st year of operation in the new St. Ludmila location. There are still many needs to be addressed in the new space, including tuition scholarship assistance for lower income families.
